chapters summarize basic concepts and findings for a major topic sketch its history and give a sense of the directions in which research is currently heading the volume also includes work related to developmental social and clinical psychology philosophy economics artificial intelligence linguistics education law and medicine scholars and students in all these fields and others will find this to be a valuable collection

this volume demonstrates how literacy is more than learning to read and write literacy creates communities organizes personal and social lives makes possible civil society and the rule of law and underwrites the commitment of both modern and developing societies to universal education and ever higher levels of literate competence everything that is involved in being and becoming literate is the concern of this interdisciplinary group of distinguished scholars

the human imagination manifests in countless different forms we imagine the possible and the impossible how do we do this so effortlessly why did the capacity for imagination evolve and manifest with undeniably manifold complexity uniquely in human beings this handbook reflects on such questions by collecting perspectives on imagination from leading experts it showcases a rich and detailed analysis on how the imagination is understood across several disciplines of study including anthropology archaeology medicine neuroscience psychology philosophy and the arts an integrated theoretical empirical applied picture of the field is presented which stands to inform researchers students and practitioners about the issues of relevance across the board when considering the imagination with each chapter the nature of human imagination is examined what it entails how it evolved and why it singularly defines us as a species

this volume provides the most comprehensive and up to date compendium of theory and research in the field of human intelligence each of the 42 chapters is written by world renowned experts in their respective fields and collectively they cover the full range of topics of contemporary interest in the study of intelligence the handbook is divided into nine parts part i covers intelligence and its measurement part ii deals with the development of intelligence part iii discusses intelligence and group differences part iv concerns the biology of intelligence part v is about intelligence and information processing part vi discusses different kinds of intelligence part vii covers intelligence and society part viii concerns intelligence in relation to allied constructs and part ix is the concluding chapter which reflects on where the field is currently and where it still needs to go

the cambridge handbook of english corpus linguistics checks surveys the breadth of corpus based linguistic research on english including chapters on collocations phraseology grammatical variation historical change and the description of registers and dialects the most innovative aspects of the check are its emphasis on critical discussion its explicit evaluation of the state of the art in each sub discipline and the inclusion of empirical case studies while each chapter includes a broad survey of previous research the primary focus is on a detailed description of the most important corpus

based studies in this area with discussion of what those studies found and why they are important each chapter also includes a critical discussion of the corpus based methods employed for research in this area as well as an explicit summary of new findings and discoveries

since its inception some fifty years ago cognitive science has seen a number of sea changes perhaps the best known is the development of connectionist models of cognition as an alternative to classical symbol based approaches a more recent and increasingly influential trend is that of dynamical systems based ecologically oriented models of the mind researchers suggest that a full understanding of the mind will require systematic study of the dynamics of interaction between mind body and world some argue that this new orientation calls for a revolutionary new metaphysics of mind according to which mental states and processes and even persons literally extend into the environment this book is a guide to this movement in cognitive science each chapter tackles either a specific area of empirical research or specific sector of the conceptual foundation underlying this research
